FEDS SERVICES - BY THE NUMBERS – SPRING 2013

Food Bank

- Served 117 students during the term
- 180 visitors during one event (freezies)
- 6 Executives and 2 Coordinators
- 25 Volunteers
- 5 Partnerships (Glow, Women's Centre, UW Outers, Off Campus Community, Athletics)
- The Food Bank collected at the Football game, and received 106lbs of food and \$190 raised.

Total of 150 students engaged through the Food Bank service, plus over 100 who dropped off food at various stations around campus and during events

The Women's Centre

- 2 Coordinators and 4 Executives
- 20 Volunteers
- Served 250 students during the term (Average of 5 people visiting the centre per day (10 weeks @ 5 days a week = 250))
- 160 people attended 14 various events/discussions
- 2 Partnerships (CRT and Food Bank)

Total of 435 students engaged through the Women's Centre service

Off Campus Community

- 2 Coordinators

- 29 Dons
- 285 people attend 3 different events
- 10 Partnerships (Off Campus Housing, UWSP, SSO, Counseling Services, Police Services, Glow, Food Bank, Athletics, Orientation, First Year Experience)

Total of 315 students engaged through the Off Campus Community service

Glow Centre

- 2 Coordinators and 7 Executives
- 375 students attended 10 different events
- Approx 25 volunteers
- Average of 8-10 people visiting the Centre per day
- 12 Partnerships (OneWaterloo, OCC, ACCKWA, Counseling Services and SASC, Tri-Pride, EngSoc, UWSP, Food Bank, Renison, Athletics, ASU)

Total of 840 students engaged through the Glow Centre

Campus Response Team

- 2 Coordinators, 8 Execs
- 20 General members
- 569 Regular Shift hours, 134 Exam Shift hours
- 200 students attended 3 unique events
- 26 Minor Incidents, 4 Moderate Incidents and 2 Severe Incidents were attended to and reported by CRT
- Several hundred community members engaged through Canada Day shifts and booth
- 17 different partnerships from other services to university programs and services to local EMS and other universities.

Total of 260 students directly engaged through Campus Response Team.

UWSP

- 2 Coordinators, 6 Executives
- 50 Volunteers
- 500 students attended 9 events and projects
- 16 Partnerships (Quidditch Club, St. Paul's, OCC, Bomber, Acabellas and Acapella Group, Glow, UW Cooking Club, Engineers Without Borders, Carbon Zero, City of Kitchener, Bike Centre, WLU Sustainability Office, Wyrd Arts Canada, CPATT, Unilock, Facility Services)

Total of 550 students engaged through UW Sustainability Project

Grand total of Students Engaged directly by 6 services this term: 2550
